General Instructions to Scouts

1. Each scout may earn two merit badges during the day's event, one in the morning session and one in the afternoon session. Scouts enrolled in the Trail to First Class may complete 2 choices per session.
2. Scouts should wear Class A uniforms.
3. Each class is limited to 20 scouts. Priority will be determined by post-mark on registration form and Rank of 1st Class and above for Eagle Merit Badges.
4. Each scout is required to bring a Blue Card signed by their Scoutmaster for each merit badge attempted. Each scout should bring paper, pencil and any pre-requisite or proof of completion of the prerequisites.
5. In order to successfully complete a merit badge, the scout must read the merit badge book and be prepared to discuss the material. In addition, the Scout needs to bring proof of completion of the prerequisites listed above. The merit badge counselors will have the final say as to whether or not the requirements have been met. If all of the requirements are not met during the class, a "partial" completion will be given.

6. Scouters, if there are any of your scouts attending the merit badge day with special needs please let the Event Coordinator know before the Merit Badge Day.
7. The Trail to First Class (TFC) is a course in which instructors demonstrate the skills necessary to complete the rank advancements. Scouts will then have the opportunity to practice and demonstrate their skills and receive a certificate listing the skills that were successfully demonstrated. Each scout will need to return to their troop and demonstrate to their Scoutmaster that he has sufficiently mastered the skill to warrant his sign-off for the rank requirement.
